Program Narrative

The Division of Public Health first received the Primary Care Services Resource Coordination and Development/New Limited Competition Award grant in September 2009. Funding is made possible jointly through the Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC) and the Bureau of Health Professions (BHP), which are both housed within the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).

This is the second of a three-year grant providing \$29,120 per year (totaling \$87,360). The overarching purpose of this grant is to improve access to primary health care services for underserved and vulnerable populations through recruitment/retention of healthcare professionals Delaware. This funding will be utilized to support healthcare recruitment/retention initiatives which will include 1) developing healthcare recruitment/retention informational materials and offering presentations/displays at appropriate venues and 2) offering a conference to educate both health care professionals and health care entities to the recruitment/retention programs available to them. The following provides an overview of the information that will be included in the informational materials: vacancies at Federally Qualified Health Centers, state agencies, and hospitals; information on how to pursue a career in a healthcare field; and information on recruitment/retention initiatives such as Conrad State 30/J-1 Visa Waiver Program, the National Health Service Corps Program, and the State Loan Repayment Program.

In the current grant period, the following have been accomplished:

- A contract with Wheeler and Associates was finalized in February 2010 to develop a Recruitment and Retention Outreach Program and to conduct a Recruitment/Retention Conference. Planning on both initiatives began immediately.
- The Recruitment/Retention Conference is scheduled for September 21, 2010 at the Duncan Center in Dover, DE.
- The template for the Recruitment and Retention Outreach Program has been created. The development of the content is now underway.
- Both projects should be completed before the budget period expires on September 29, 2010.

Budget Comparison

The funding request for the budget year September 30, 2010 – September 29, 2011 is \$29,210 in federal funds. This remains the same as last year.
